

Sonora Elementary Goals and Objectives

GOAL #1: Sonora Elementary School will increase academic achievement of all students in reading.

- **OBJECTIVE #1:** Kindergarten students will identify all letters and sounds, decode basic cvc words, and recognize at least twenty-five sight words.
- **OBJECTIVE #2**: First grade students will independently read grade level text at 60 wpm with "developed" comprehension as measured by TPRI.
- **OBJECTIVE #3:** Second grade students will independently read grade level text at 90 wpm with "developed" comprehension as measured by TPRI and will perform at a minimum of 80% mastery on TPRI spelling.
- **OBJECTIVE** #4: By May 2019, 60% of Third, Fourth and Fifth grade students will reach Meets Grade Level on the Reading portion of the STAAR test and the number of students that reach Masters Grade Level will increase by 10%.
- **OBJECTIVE** #5: By May 2019, Sonora Elementary will improve the performance of students identified as English Learners on the STAAR Reading assessments by 5% and 80% will meet or exceed progress.
- **OBJECTIVE** #6: By May 2019, Sonora Elementary will improve the performance of students identified as Special Education and related services on the STAAR Reading assessments by 5% and 80% will meet or exceed progress.

GOAL #2: Sonora Elementary School will increase academic achievement of all students in writing.

• **OBJECTIVE #1:** By May 2019, 90% of all students in grade 4 will reach Approaches Grade Level on the writing portion of the STAAR.

GOAL #3: Sonora Elementary School will increase academic achievement of all students in math.

- **OBJECTIVE #1:** By May 2019, 80% of Kindergarten and First grade students will reach Tier 1 Mastery on locally developed math performance assessment.
- **OBJECTIVE #2:** By May 2019, 80% of Second grade students will reach Meets Grade Level in Renaissance STAR Math.
- **OBJECTIVE** #3: By May 2019, 80% of Third, Fourth, and Fifth grade students will reach Meets Grade Level on the Math portion of the STAAR test and the number of students that reach Masters Grade Level will increase by 10%.
- **OBJECTIVE #4:** By May 2019, Sonora Elementary will improve the performance of students identified as English Learners on the STAAR Math assessments by 5% and 90% will meet or exceed progress.
- **OBJECTIVE #5:** By May 2019, Sonora Elementary will improve the performance of students identified as Special Education and related services on the STAAR Math assessments by 5% and 100% will meet or exceed progress.

GOAL #4: Sonora Elementary School will increase academic achievement of all students in science.

• **OBJECTIVE** #1: By May 2019, 60% of Fifth grade students will reach Meets Grade Level on the Science portion of the STAAR test and the number of students that reach Masters Grade Level will increase by 10%.

GOAL #5: Sonora Elementary will close the performance gap between economically disadvantaged students and non-economically disadvantaged students.

• **OBJECTIVE #1:** By May 2019, Sonora Elementary will reach a scale score of 79 on Closing the Gaps.

GOAL #6: Sonora Elementary School will improve student attendance and reduce potential for future dropouts.

- **OBJECTIVE #1:** Sonora Elementary will reduce retention rates related to attendance and students will make progress toward meeting the campus attendance goal of 97.5%; therefore, surpassing the state attendance standard of 97% for student attendance including the at-risk population.
- **OBJECTIVE #2:** Enhance educational opportunities for children between the ages of three and five.

GOAL #7: Sonora Elementary School will increase parental involvement.

• **OBJECTIVE #1:** Sonora Elementary School will increase parental knowledge of, support for, involvement in, and contributions to the school program.

GOAL #8: Create a learning environment that is safe, drug free, and conducive to learning.

• **OBJECTIVE #1:** Increase social skills, self-esteem and academic performance of all students.

GOAL #9: By May 2019, the Sonora Elementary faculty and students will proficiently utilize technology equipment.
