- **OBJECTIVE #1**: Kindergarten students will identify all letters and sounds, decode basic cvc words, and recognize at least twenty-five sight words, and achieve at least 80% mastery on Renaissance Star Early Literacy.
- **OBJECTIVE #2**: First grade students will independently read grade level text at 60 wpm with "developed" comprehension as measured by TPRI and 80% of students score mastery on Renaissance Star Reading.
- **OBJECTIVE #3:** Second grade students will independently read grade level text at 90 wpm with "developed" comprehension as measured by TPRI, will perform at a minimum of 80% mastery on TPRI spelling and 80% of students score mastery on Renaissance Star Reading.
- **OBJECTIVE** #4: By May 2024, 60% of Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth grade students will reach Meets Grade Level on the Reading portion of the STAAR test and 30% of Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth grade students will reach Masters Grade Level on the STAAR test.
- **OBJECTIVE #5:** By May 2024, 35% of Emergent Bilingual Learners will reach Meets Grade Level on the Reading Portion of the STAAR test.
- **OBJECTIVE** #6: By May 2024, 25% of students identified as Special Education and related services will score Meets Grade Level on the STAAR Reading assessments
